June 6th Black Diamond will celebrate its eighth annual Welsh Heritage Day. Festivities are planned for noon to 3:30 p.m.

The town of Black Diamond was founded primarily by Welsh coal miners in the 1880's. Come meet Welsh descendants, share stories, pictures and memorabilia and listen to Welsh music performed by *Dinas o Frain*.

Dr. Gary Zimmerman, President of the Fiske Genealogical Society Foundation will present a slide show on the Welsh immigration to America.

Wilkeson's Centennial Celebration

On July 18th PSWA has been asked to participate in the Wilkeson's centennial celebration. As The Welsh were perhaps the largest ethnic group in Wilkeson WA, it is fitting to have a Welsh song at the festivities, Eric Bowen, one of our members from Bellingham, has agreed to sing at the dedication of a monument to "all the coal miners and quarrymen who put our town on the map."

The monument, carved by Yelm artist Paul Keeslar, will appropriately be made of sandstone and depict two scenes: a miner in 1942 emerging from a mine, and quarryman in 1910 shaping sandstone pavers. Ex-Secretary of State Ralph Munro will be as Master of Ceremonies for the event.

Saturday July 18th, festivities will kick off with the town's monument dedication at 10am at the town hall followed by the parade at 11am.

Several PSWA members will be participating in the parade wearing something Welsh; a Welsh kilt, Welsh rugby shirt, Welsh costume as we carry the Welsh flag and PSWA banner.

The celebration will be coupled with the Wilkeson Booster Club's Annual Handcar Races event already in its 34th year. The Seattle Cossacks, a renowned motorcycle stunt and drill team, will perform at noon. All afternoon on Saturday spectators can watch the competition from contestants in the handcar races, lawnmower races, and old fashion tug-of-war contest at the Coke Oven Park or stroll down town with

vendors, good food, street music and games for children. At noon on Sunday, the 19th, the Carbon Canyon Model "T" club will holding a antique car show (cars range from about 1915-1927) in front and back of the Eagles Hall in downtown Wilkeson.

Castles of Wales XI

The French-named Beaumaris castle located in Anglesey was the last and largest castle authorized by King Edward I. It was begun in 1295 and supervised by castle builder James of St. George who originated a very sophisticated design with geometric symmetry. 2600 men were used in its original construction. But it

was never finished. Edward became too busy with other projects. By 1298 funds to continue building had been exhausted. An attacker would have to survive eleven "murder holes" to reach the inner ward with its several towers. The chapel tower now contains a museum showing the castles of Edward I.

The castle is surrounded with a moat, which is home to many ducks and swans. There are picnic tables for visitors and a view of Menai Strait. Its beauty is unsurpassed; it is recommended that visitors avoid the more touristy castles, such as Harlech or Caernarvon and head for Beaumaris. What remains is a blueprint for what was to come and is probably the finest example of Welsh castle building. It saw little action until Madog ap Llewelyn's unsuccessful revolt and it survived Cromwell's plan to blow it up.

A Swansea Pilgrimage,

Sian Davies-Vollum, Tacoma, March 1st 2009

My parents are Swansea born and bred. They grew up there during the Second World War and experienced the bombing that flattened part of the city. After they married they "emigrated" to England but returned often. I remember trips to Swansea when I was a child to visit grandparents and aging aunts. As I grew older the trips became less frequent. With my parents now in their seventies, and my daughter having never set foot in Wales, I decided it was time for us all to visit.

So, last summer we set off on a pilgrimage to reclaim our heritage and share our memories. We stayed near the docks, now gentrified with townhouses and art galleries. They are not quite as smart as the Cardiff docks, and lack the imposing presence of the Welsh Assembly Hall but they do house three museums, all of them free! Within the museums it is possible to trace the story of industry in Wales, discover the history of Swansea and learn

about Swansea's best loved poet, Dylan Thomas. The Dylan Thomas museum is a gem with a tremendous bookstore cum tearoom. My father was thrilled to see pictures of Swansea grammar school, his and Thomas', alma mater that is sadly no longer standing. From the docks it is a short walk to the city center. The heart of the city, in contrast to the docks, is in a state of transition; some of the buildings that were put up quickly following the Second World War have been torn down and a new road system is in progress. One hallmark of the city center that hasn't been changed, however, is the market. It is here that you go to find everything and anything Welsh from laver bread (the local dish made of seaweed) to rugby shirts. Bakeries sell Welsh cakes and the fishmongers serve cockles fresh from Swansea bay. Hand carved love spoons sit incongruously next to tea towels festooned with leeks and daffodils. If we were going to feel Welsh anywhere it was here!

No trip to Swansea would be complete without a visit to the city's "playground", the gorgeous Gower peninsula. Here are some of the most beautiful and unspoiled beaches in Europe. Rhossili, at the western tip of the peninsula, is a grand sweep of a bay fringed by golden sands at the bottom of dramatic cliffs, the surf some of the best in Europe. The British National Trust keeps trails through farmland that lead down to the beach and out to Worm's Head, an island only accessible during low tide. The Mumbles, birthplace of Catherine Zeta Jones, is the gateway to the Gower. With its sea front promenade and cafes it is far more of a seaside town than remote Rhossili. Joe's ice cream parlor has one of its two Swansea area branches in The Mumbles and it is here we end up at the end of our visit. Joe was an Italian immigrant who came to Swansea during the 1920's and started selling ice cream made to a secret family recipe. The taste of it transports us back in time. My father swears it tastes the same as when he was a boy in the 1940s and I am certain that it is just the same as when I was a girl in the 1970s. My daughter, a Joe's novice, proclaims it is the best ice cream she has ever tasted. Joe's is a fitting place for us to end our pilgrimage, with memories both old, and new of three generations of the Davies family.
